- Projects must be of a wider community benefit and funding cannot be granted to supplement spend within the school's statutory requirements.
 - Applications can only be made by a class group or school collectively who will take on the development and delivery of the project.
 - Individual pupils cannot apply themselves.
 - Funding can only be granted to an organisational bank account, such as the school, PTA, or an external voluntary partner organisation.
 - To make budgets go further, the school may choose to source external funding towards the total cost.
 - If the project cost is above the available grant, but the school is unable to source external funding, this will be discussed between the school and the board on a case-by-case basis.
 - If the project comes in under budget, the grant will only be given for the actual cost.
 - Projects must meet corporate and local aims to be eligible to win the prize funding.
 - The Community Board will assess eligibility of the submissions against the criteria for community board funding.
 - A judging panel will verify the votes to agree the winners.
 - The results of the grant awards will be presented in the board's Annual Engagement event in April 2023 and the project should be fully scoped ready for delivery (either by the school or chosen project delivery partner organisation) before the end of the Summer term
