Physical Development (Gross Motor Skills, Fine Motor Skills)	<p>Continues to develop movement, balancing, riding and ball skills.</p> <p>Go up steps and stairs, or climb up apparatus using alternate feet.</p> <p>Uses large-muscle movements to wave flags and streamers, paint and make marks.</p>	<p>Skips, hops, stands on one leg and holds a pose for a game like musical statues.</p> <p>Starts taking part in some group activities which they make up for themselves, or in teams.</p>	<p>Collaborates with others to manage large items.</p> <p>Uses one handed tools and equipment.</p> <p>Uses a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens and pencils.</p>
