This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

<p>Pupils at LCPS get a rich experience of Music Provision:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• KS2 children will learn 4 x musical instruments during their Primary journey all of these lessons are taught by specialist teachers and class sets of each instrument is provided by LCPS.• Year 6 have a whole-class ukulele lesson every week• Year 5 have a whole-class keyboard lesson every week• Year 4 have a whole-class violin lesson every week• Year 3 have a whole-class djembe drum lesson every week• KS1 have a weekly music lesson following the Charanga scheme of work• EYFS have a weekly music lesson and daily opportunities for singing

Part B: Co-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

In addition to this, pupils that are in receipt of Pupil Premium receive funded music lessons that covers the cost entirely.

Part C: Musical experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

Year 5 and 6 children take part in Voice in a Million every two years.

- Year 4 children take part in the Echoes music festival at the Royal Albert Hall every Year playing violin.
- All children from Reception-Year 6 have a weekly singing assembly with a specialist singing teacher.
- We hold an Annual Music Celebration Evening every June where we have a minimum 50 children performing to a large audience of parents.

In the future
