Another incredible week of learning, resilience and respect. Well done to all the children. Here are some of the highlights in class:

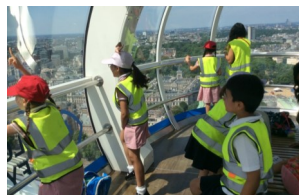
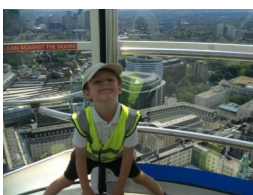
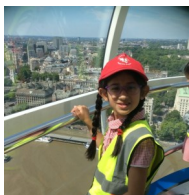
Nursery: This week in Nursery the children explored creative thinking! Inspired by the stories *Not a Box* and *Not a Stick*, they combined concepts from the books with their own brilliant ideas to create some truly amazing models and artwork.

Reception: has definitely been our class visit to the Chiltern Open Air Museum. Thankfully a day of outdoor activities was much more enjoyable with the cooler temperatures. The children displayed remarkable engagement and commendable conduct across all the 'Little Red Hen' activities we took part in. We are immensely proud of their enthusiastic participation and their exemplary behaviour.

Year 1: This week Year 1 have explored the weather in our learning about seasonal changes. The children used their observation skills and senses to identify the weather during the school day. We created symbols to recognise different types of weather and recorded our observations in a table. The children also used their knowledge to become weather presenters themselves, working in pairs to deliver their very own weather forecast using key vocabulary and maps. Well done Year 1!



Year 2: Had a brilliant time at the London Eye today bringing their Geography topic on "London" to life.



Year 3: It has been another fantastic week in Year 3! The children have done an excellent job writing their own play scripts, showing great creativity. In French, they enjoyed taking part in a French café, practising their language skills by ordering food and drinks. In geography, the class explored how farming in the Chilterns has changed over the last 100 years. The highlight of the week was our visit to the Chiltern Open Air Museum. The children loved pond dipping, identifying the creatures they caught, before investigating owl pellets to discover what owls had eaten. It was a fascinating day that everyone thoroughly enjoyed while displaying our school values!

Year 4: have been exploring charts in Maths, comparing, interpreting, and even creating our own graphs. In Guided Reading, we explored a new poem called *The River*. We annotated the poem to develop our understanding of its structure and meaning, before rehearsing and performing it in front of the class. In Topic, we explored the city of Bologna in Italy, looking at its culture and its links to the Mediterranean Sea. One of our activities involved acting out what life is like in the city of Bologna.

Year 5: Have explored cubic centimetres in maths, using cubes to understand different shapes and amounts of volume. In Geography, we looked at the risks of Volcanoes and earthquakes, applying prior knowledge of tectonic plates and boundaries to understand how they are formed. Year 5 have had a very focused week, demonstrating lots of respect and readiness. Well done!

Year 6: have been incredible this week helping to organise the French Café, set up the PTA Summer Fair as well as rehearse for their leaver's assembly. Well done to all the children—they are definitely on track to leave a lasting, positive legacy!
